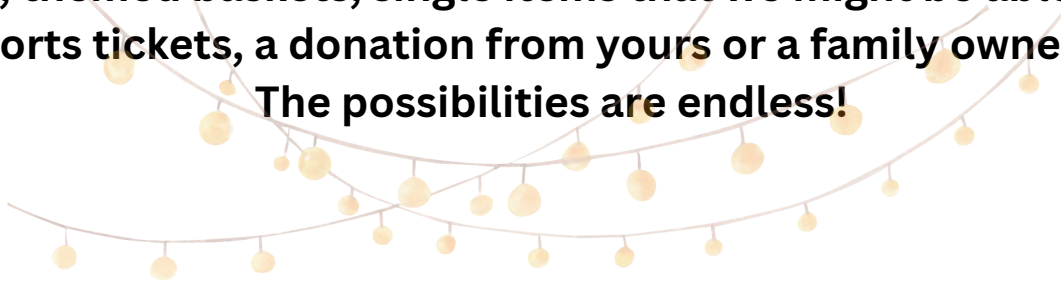

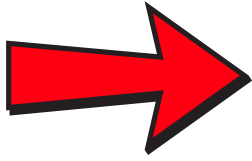

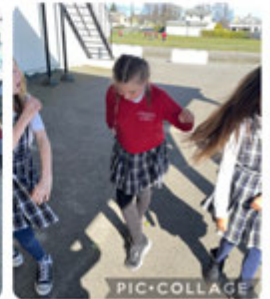

NURSE NOTES

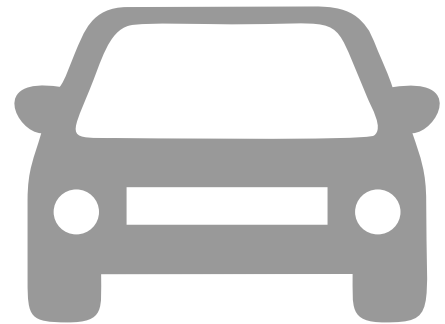
Drink Up!



When you or your child is sick it's important to remember that maintaining adequate hydration is crucial to a speedy recovery. A good rule of thumb is to drink enough water until your urine is clear. If you or your child are losing fluids through diarrhea then you'll need to offer an oral rehydration solution, like Pedialyte, to replace some lost electrolytes (stay away from juice, pop, or caffeinated beverages) . At the end of the day, no matter what type of germ is causing the illness, make sure to drink! (Popsicles and jello count as liquid too ;})
