Executive Functioning Skill of the Month

Planning

Planning is one of the core executive functioning skills that helps individuals organize their thoughts and actions to achieve goals effectively. It's like the brain's "roadmap" function—allowing us to look ahead, anticipate obstacles, and chart a clear path forward.

Classroom Highlight Eighth Grade

We started the year by reviewing the prerequisite skills needed for success in Pre-Algebra and recently completed our first chapter test. The week before break, students applied their knowledge of integers and coordinate planes to navigate treasure maps. Every pair of students located at least one "treasure," which earned them a kickball game against the grade level of their choice. The majority voted to challenge the 6th grade—and I'm happy to report that 8th grade won! Since transitioning into ELA, students have explored a variety of informational texts. We read an article from the National Museum of the American Latino explaining the significance of Hispanic Heritage Month, as well as a Simply Psychology article on intrinsic and extrinsic motivation. At the conclusion of our Hispanic Heritage Month unit, students shared their understanding with younger grades in creative ways—posters, slide decks, fictional st<mark>ories that incorporated r</mark>eal facts, and even a rap performed for the 4th grade!

In the coming weeks, we'll move into short stories and focus on identifying key elements of literature. In religion, students will create informative posters for a walk-through related to their roles in the upcoming Christmas play. In math, we will continue to move forward in pre-algebra and complete chapter two by Christmas break.
